Guidance for applicants

Thank you for your interest in the UK Nuclear Manufacturing Award for young manufacturing engineers. Please read the information below about the award, including guidance for completing the application form. **Closing date for applications is 4pm, Wednesday 11 September 2024.**

THE AWARD

The Young Manufacturing Engineer Award will recognise an individual who has made exceptional contributions and achievements in the nuclear manufacturing industry. Nominations must come from the individual's employer.

Nominated individuals must be no more than 25 years old on 30 June 2024.

The ideal candidate should:

- Demonstrate maturity and experience above their years. They may be performing on a par (or above par) with more experienced colleagues.
- Act as an ambassador for the nuclear engineering and manufacturing sector.
- Be able to inspire young people into engineering, based on their experiences.
- Carry out charity work or volunteer in engineering-related activities, either inside or outside work time.

WHAT ARE THE JUDGES LOOKING FOR?

- Roles, responsibilities and key duties of the nominated individual.
- Evidence that the applicant has made substantial progress in their chosen discipline to date. What achievements have they made in their current role, and have they undertaken additional qualifications or training to take them to the next level?
- Evidence of outstanding attitudes and behaviours.
- Support from senior management.
- A personal development programme which is relevant to your business activities for future growth

Please note, the judges reserve the right to also consider this nomination for Large Employer of the Year Award or SME Employer of the Year Award, if they determine this nomination as suitably qualified for those categories as well.

Your full application should answer the following questions:

- What are the applicant's key duties, roles and responsibility within the company?
- Can you demonstrate the applicant's high achievement in practical or academic skills?
- Has the applicant been involved in any charity or voluntary work, especially any related to engineering and encouraging young people into the manufacturing sector?
- What new ideas, innovation activities or cost savings have they introduced or implemented?
- How have they gone above and beyond expectations in their role?
- Has the applicant taken on any additional training, qualifications or responsibilities?
- How has the applicant has contributed to the company's performance or achievements? This could be in terms of new products or services, increased profits, new markets entered, or streamlining existing processes.
- What are their career aspirations over the next five years? This should include any training and development needs required to achieve the new position.
- How will their recently developed skills benefit the company?
- Why does the applicant stand out as an exemplar employee?
- How and why is the applicant a role model for others, and an inspiration to other young engineers?

IMPORTANT: Your application should be no more than 1500 words and written in the box below.

Additional material to support your application is welcome, but should be no more than three additional pages. This could include testimonials from peers, managers or training providers.

You may also include a short video of up to two minutes. This could be the applicant speaking to the camera, or a testimonial from a manager, training provider or colleague.

The judges' decision is final.
